The Women's Studies Program is a flexible interdisciplinary academic program devoted to the critical analysis of gender and the pursuit of knowledge about women. Combining the methods and insights of Women's Studies Scholarship, our courses yield fresh perspectives which illuminate the origins of and changes in diverse cultural and social arrangements. The Women's Studies major is broad as well as flexible, and each student's plan of study can readily reflect individual interests as well as compliment a second major.
